



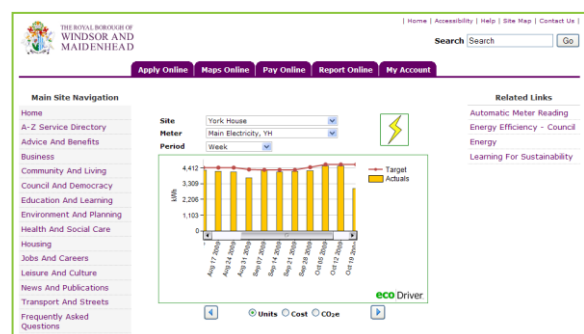
With a desire to improve the energy performance of their buildings, the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead (RBWM) contacted TR Control Solutions Ltd in 2008 looking for a system that would enable them to monitor and promote their energy performance to both their staff and their customers.

Keen to implement eco|Driver™ but cautious about wanting to prove the potential benefits before they committed to a large roll-out, the council pragmatically approved a trial of the system at Windsor Town Hall (York House) in November 2008. It soon became clear however that the eco|Driver™ system delivered the benefits predicted and in June 2009 the council approved an extension to the project to add a further six flagship buildings.

A key feature of RBWM's requirements was that the information provided by the system should be easily accessible to the residents of the borough, via the council's corporate website.

Referring to this RBWM initiative, in a speech on consumerism and behaviour change and the importance of 'transparency', in October 2009, David Cameron the leader of the opposition, commented *'That's what is happening in Windsor – imagine if we extended this to every public building in the country'*.
